William Bartram (1739-1823) and The Bartram Trail

William Bartram was an American naturalist and the inspiration for the name of the Bartram Garden Club of Amelia Island because of his exploration of this area and his early documentation of flora and fauna of the region.

The Bartram Trail Conference, Inc., was founded in 1976 to identify and mark the route of Bartram's southern explorations and to promote interest in developing recreational trails and botanical gardens along the route.

The **Bartram Trail** follows the approximate route of Bartram's southern journey from March 1773 to January 1777. Bartram explored much of the territory which now comprises the states of Tennessee, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, and Louisiana.

In March 1774, Bartram began his much anticipated trip to East Florida. He landed on the north end of Amelia Island and traveled through Old Fernandina to Lord Egmont's plantation where modern Fernandina now stands.
