The Camera Corner

Holiday Lights Photography

Explore festive holiday lights and capture creative photos in the community or at home. Fancy, heavy, or expensive photo gear not needed. Simply start clicking those Smart Phones.

Photograph outdoor lights around dusk when ambient light can help capture surrounding trees, bushes, structures, and sky. **Turn off the flash** feature **when photographing outside.** A flash might be necessary, however, when photographing indoor holiday trees. Try it both ways.

In general, **use a slower shutter speed**, and the automatic Smart Phone Night Mode feature, if offered. To capture fireworks with a phone, use the Burst Mode. Pick the best image or combine several to create a GIF.

Use different perspectives and look for interesting details in a wideangle shot which help tell a photo story. Hold the phone still using both hands for the time it takes to finish the night-time exposure. Use a tripod or prop against a steady surface. Shoot from different angles for interest. Perspective plays a big part in capturing holiday moments. Try some shots in portrait mode and others in landscape.
