The Camera Corner

Avoid slanted horizons

Click "Camera" on cell phone "Settings", and select "Grid." To adjust a slanted image, use the Edit feature and the Rotate tool.

Avoid bright sunlight

Shoot just after sunrise and just before sunset.

Capture impressive skies

Shoot when the sky is stormy or on days with white, fluffy clouds.

Create a sense of depth

Incorporate leading lines, and objects in the foreground. Shoot from different levels and angles.

Establish a focal point

Include a foreground object placed at one of the lower two junction points on the grid.

Strive for simplicity

Select scenes with only one or two elements and focus on those; use negative spaces to help subjects stand out.
