

Native milkweeds are optimal choices for our landscapes but we all love the tropical varieties. Please remember to cut back tropical milkweeds during the months of October and November. This encourages our monarch butterflies to migrate and also protects caterpillars from ingesting the protozoan parasite Ophryocystis elektroscirrha.
